

AAUW Releases State-By-State Rankings for Equal Pay Day

D.C. Has Best Ranking, Wyoming Worst



FACE PAY EQUITY

"Equal Pay Day, which this year falls on April 17, is an unfortunate reminder of how far we have to go to reach true pay equality. The wage gap hasn't moved significantly in nearly a decade, and at this rate, we'll be marking Equal Pay Day for the next 60 years," said AAUW Executive Director Linda D. Hallman, CAE.

"The gender pay gap is unlikely to go away on its own. Our publications and tools will empower our advocacy on behalf of women and their families," said Catherine Hill, AAUW director of research. "The Simple Truth is a useful resource for women, the media, and society at large as we work to address this stubborn inequality."

Women of Distinction

Held in conjunction with the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders, the Women of Distinction Awards Ceremony pays tribute to women leaders who have made extraordinary contributions in their professions or their communities. The award winners are leaders in their fields, innovators of unique programs and services, and lifelong advocates for promoting equity for women and girls everywhere. Liza Donnelly is one of five award winners. I will profile others in future Forums.

Liza Donnelly is a staff cartoonist for the New Yorker. When she first began selling her work to the magazine in 1979, she was the youngest and one of only three women cartoonists to do so. Her cartoons have been exhibited around the world.
