Joan Vicari, **Iibrarian at OC High School**, **earns Outstanding Media Specialist 2018 from the NJ Association of School Librarians**. This award honors a certified New Jersey school library media specialist who, through individual and sustained effort, has made outstanding contributions to the operation of effective school library media services and to advancing the role of the school library media center in the total educational program.

Joan Vicari developed the first Ocean City High School Library in 1983-1984. This library was the first automated school library in South Jersey (second in the state) with a computerized circulation system, an online computer catalog, and online information searching with DIALOG. Joan had the opportunity to create the second OCHS Library in the new building in 2004.



Joan sent the following: I joined AAUW (the Atlantic County Chapter) in 1986 and served on the program committee from 1987-1995.

I have been a joint member with the Cape May County Branch for over 4 years and have been active with the CMC AAUW evening book club since joining that branch.

I have been assisting with the AAUW Tech Trek Camp by encouraging schools to nominate a girl to attend, and by assisting at the camp every summer. Last summer, I worked with Marion Ingram to collect snacks for the campers and volunteers. This year, I will be heading the snack drive.

I was a presenter of a program created by my daughter, Laura Beth Fulton, at the AAUW TeenTech Day in May 2017.
