I'm honored and challenged by having been elected President of our Branch of AAUW. Honored because our Branch has a successful and estimable 102 year history of working to help women achieve gender equity. And challenged because AAUW has been faced with the same facts and trends as most volunteer organizations across America: younger women moved from unpaid work in the home to too often *underpaid* work outside of the home *plus unpaid work at home.* Something had to go, and that often was the unpaid but critically important volunteer work for religious, civic and political organizations. The result was an increased average membership age, and reduced money raised to achieve the entity's goals.

A third realty must also be acknowledged: America has been racially and ethnically segregated from slavery and the near-destruction of the Native American populations to Reconstruction to Jim Crow to imprisoning Japanese Americans Red-lining to separate and unequal education, transportation, housing, finance, prison systems, government, politics.... and yes, our social, religious and cultural institutions, including those in the LGBTQI community.

Some of our 50 year plus members told me our Branch was a leader even back in the 1970's when teacher and African American Alice Carter was President; nevertheless today our Branch does not reflect the diversity of our community and we would like to change that.

My challenge as Branch President is to speak truth as I see it with our strong, highly educated members so that, together, we can progress as swiftly and significantly as possible. We have already made much progress and we are capable of achieving much more. Under the capable leadership of Program Vice President Shelly Meyers we are examining our 2020 Branch programs, *for which we urge your suggestions and comments*:

- Minimize the number of meetings held at expensive venues.
- Move our Board and committee meetings from restaurants to free locations
- Hold Board and committee meetings after usual office hours.
- Whenever possible, accommodate members' child care responsibilities

Finally, as I approached many women about joining AAUW, I learned that almost all thought they had to be "invited" to join! And sadly, some viewed us as a rather exclusive organization. When I disabused them of those false images, all were delighted to have been asked to join and most did so. *If every member likewise "invites" three friends, co-workers or acquaintances to join, we'll have to hold our next "new member" event in a very large venue!*

We are trying something new with the cooperation of Tilton Square Theatre and the Otto Bruyns Public Library in Northfield. Movies will be available for viewing at 10 a.m. on the second Thursday of each month (with the exception of September's) alternating between the Tilton and Northfield library. The cost at Tilton Square will be \$8, but for the luxurious seats that is a bargain. We will have the use of the party room for free afterwards to be able to discuss the film. To keep the cost down, you may brown bag a lunch or order in. You do not have to purchase food at the theater. Movies will not be current run (usually) as the studios will not cooperate with the theater let alone with our intent to view woman centric(theme, director or writer) grown up (as opposed to usual teenage action flicks) documentaries, foreign and independent films. They will be free when at the Northfield library which will also allow food to be brought in and time for discussion after the film. If there is sufficient interest, there may be a second showing in the evening at the library for those who cannot attend those during the day. Family, friends and the public are welcome at both venues.

On Wednesday, **September 11**, the film will be *Wadja* which was the first film shot entirely in Saudi Arabia and, more impressive, with a female Saudi director. It is the story of a girl who wants to be permitted to buy a bicycle. It will be shown at the Tilton Square Theatre. On **October 10**, due to the recent death of the renowned author Toni Morrison, the film will be a newly available documentary called *Toni Morrison: The Pieces I Am* which will be shown at the Northfield Library. **November 14** will be *The Guardians* (not the Marvel comic one) at Tilton and the **December 12** feature will be *The Girls in the Band* at Northfield Library.
