- at our October 15th Branch Meeting, Jenine Brown, our new Public Policy Chairperson, will present recent N.J. laws that impact women. The other two Panelists, new member Attorney Mary Maudsley and I, will review recent U.S. Supreme Court cases of particular interest to our members, and we hope for a vigorous discussion with all of our members.

Seneca Falls and the Early Suffragettes

Your very new Branch President just spent two days on a 16 hour round trip bus ride to Seneca Falls New York, where four members of our Branch and I joined 41 other NJ-AAUW members as we toured the Women's Right's National Historic Park, home of the first Women's Rights Convention. That is where the early Suffragettes gathered in 1948 "... to discuss the social, civil, and religious condition and **rights** of woman". From there we went on to The Women's Hall of Fame and Harriet Tubman's home and farm in her senior years. The tours were fascinating and very informative and the weather and scenery were magnificent. But the most valuable part of the trip was meeting the many branch presidents and former presidents from whom I learned so much during the trip.

On Saturday, October 12th I will be heading to Mount Laurel New Jersey for the NJ -AAUW Fall Festival to learn more ways to grow and improve our already wonderful branch.
