The following is excerpted from a statement released on September 10, 2019 by AAUW.

"Pay equity has dominated headlines this year, but change has yet to reach our pocketbooks and bank accounts. Today's news is that women still make 82 cents on the dollar compared to men. And the numbers are dramatically worse for Black women (62 cents) and Latinas (54 cents) compared to white men These statistics have been stuck around the same levels for almost two decades. Based on historic rates, the gap won't close for 75 years – until 2093.

2019 was a monumental year for pay equity laws with a record 11 states laws from across the political spectrum – enacting new legislation. On a federal level, the Paycheck Fairness Act passed in the U.S. House of Representatives and remains under consideration in the U.S. Senate.

Employers around the country are changing policies some of which are aimed at stopping practices that perpetuate the pay gap.

Individuals can take action – by learning to advocate for their financial futures through <u>AAUW's Work Smart</u> salary negotiation tool.
