Dear Members.

Last evening 36 of us gathered together and shared the pleasure of seeing old friends and learning together from Phyliss Merion Shanken, Psychologist, Author and Writing Consultant. For 4 years she has also taught two FELS classes: Psychology of Everyday Relationships & ITS HOW YOU TELL THE STORY: Creative Writing. The discussion that ensued was lively, with members sharing personal challenges and awakenings and discussing ways we are dealing with the stressors in today's rapidly changing world.

Stimulating programs and discussions are something AAUW members have done for decades. But this time we did it in via iPads, computers and cell phones. All 36 participants signed into Zoom with an ease that belied the insulting image of older women lost to today's technology. Cudos to all of us!

As you can see from Jackie's Program Committee Report, her committee has continued to meet and work during the shutdown; they have nimbly adjusted our previously planned programs to this new reality.

The Finance committee, ably led by Lois Fried, has a small but diverse and talented Committee prepared to execute whatever decisions the full Board makes to resolve all Trust Fund issues at our upcoming April 30th Board meeting. At that time the Board will consider and vote on the following motion initially passed at the February Branch meeting at the Northfield Library. Since many members missed that meeting, here is a copy of what was unanimously adopted then. However, to assure full transparency, I decided to put it up for reconsideration and decision by the Board on April 30th. For clarification: recommendations by the Finance and Scholarship committees for expenditures from the Trust Fund will, of course, continue to be decided by Board vote.

It is hereby moved that AC-AAUW

- 1)Terminate the existing trust and trustee,
- 2) Transfer the trust funds to a new fund to be created with the Community Fund of South Jersey as Trustee,
- 3) Create that new AAUW-AC Trust with the purpose stated as: "to advance equity for women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy, and research".
- 4) Continue to fund raise in cooperation with AWCO to best advance our mutual goals, and
- 5) Authorize the finance committee of Lois Fried, Jacalyn Shelley-Tasoff, Beverly Schechtman, Carol Zerbe, Lynne Caterson and Arlene Groch to complete these transactions.

Finally, we now also have a Bylaws committee to recommend modernization of our Bylaws. Jackie has graciously offered to take on that responsibility as well, with the support of members Lynn Caterson, Mary Maudsley, Carolyn Bassett, Stella Hordes, Gail Zona and Joan Leavy.
