What a wonderful single day. My email inbox contained these three emails:

- 1. Pam Tyson wrote: "It is good to keep learning. And I have found after joining AAUW and STAR, how much more I appreciate and want to learn more."
- 2. Beverly Schechtman wrote: Please welcome Sandra Kahn, our newest member.
- 3. Judith Dickerson belatedly responded to an invitation I'd sent to her when I first became President of our Branch back last year wrote: "I'd love to join! How do I proceed?"

That got me reflecting on this Message I'd written in the September Forum:

My challenge as Branch President is to speak truth as I see it with our strong, highly educated members so that, together, we can progress as swiftly and significantly as possible.

I'm feeling very energized by what we've accomplished so far. We have a wonderful organization and a lot to share with women who need only to be asked to join. So *ASK*! When you do, here's a quick summary of what you can tell them we've accomplished in just the past 18 months:

Membership: We added roughly 34 new members! Thank you, **Linda Karp**! This alone is an accomplishment worthy of celebration. I believe and hope that our reputation has grown that we are a welcoming place for educated women to share, learn, collaborate and contribute. *Please share that message to help us keep growing*.

The Trust Fund: Our AC-AAUW Fund is the newest member of the Community Foundation of South Jersey! The sum of \$57,973.22 has been transferred from the Bank of America to the CFSJ, whose purpose is:

The Community Foundation of South Jersey (CFSJ) helps South Jersey residents harness the power of philanthropy to transform their community and the issues they care about most. The Foundation helps donors to create funds—both large and small—achieve positive results with their generosity in South Jersey and beyond. By working with the Community Foundation, donors can engage in philanthropy that is innovative, visionary, and effective.

Structural: After many work sessions by another group of hard-working members led by **Jackie Shelley-Tassoff**, the ByLaws committee will make its recommendation to the Board meeting December 2nd at 7pm. As always, all branch members are welcome and encouraged to attend and participate in the discussion. If approved by majority vote of the Board, the By-Laws as they may have been Amended by the Board will then be referred to the full Branch. On January <u>13th</u>, 7pm, our Branch will meet to discuss and vote on the By-Laws. Each person who is a member on January 13th is entitled to vote. A two-thirds majority is required for adoption of amendments to our Bylaws, so please mark your calendar for that day in bold type.

Fundraising: In a creative fashion, **Kathy Zeigenfus** and **Carol Zerbe** and their dedicated committee are managing to raise a LOT of money this year, even without a real-time dinner party. I will let them reveal the wonderful total to date.

From our controversial September, 2019 forum where the **County Candidates** fully expressed themselves, to the upcoming **November 2020 Challah, Soup and Onion-slicing cooking demo** by Chef Kelly, here is a memory lane travel through some of what we've written, learned, taught and tasted:

- > Women who served in the military inspired and challenged us with their stories.
- My published Press editorial proclaimed "our opposition to system racism, our support for Black Lives Matter and our recognition that those of us who are White [...] need to learn how to be anti-racists"
- > Throughout the summer 8 brave members shared/demoed their **passions and hobbies**
- Kathy Zeigenfus taught us so much about the 100th Anniversary of the Suffragists' fight for the vote for white women – it took dozens more years till Black and Women of Color got the vote (2)
- > Carolyn Bassett created a bi-weekly study group, "For a More Equal Society"
- Then her study group taught AAUW members from throughout NJ how systemic racism and white privilege impact all of us, as we learned from Carolyn Bassett about The Invention of Race, from Nadine Flynn about Redlining, and from Ann-Maria Guevara about Mass Incarceration
- The impact of their study group and program continues: at least two other Branches have asked Carolyn to help them form similar study groups
- > We learned delicious Vegetarian Dinner Recipes from Linda Karp
- > And we learned the **History of Voter Suppression** from Mary Maudsley and Claire Abernathy.
- > All that plus lots of great book, film and travel discussions.

My cup runneth over. Just imagine what we will accomplish in 2021!

I am very proud that our AAUW-AC is now partnered with the Community Foundation of South Jersey [CFSJ or "the Foundation"]. Here's one reason why:

When COVID-19 hit South Jersey the CFSJ created the South Jersey COVID-19 Response Fund to raise and rapidly deploy flexible emergency resources to 501(c)3 non-profits in our 8county region which were immediately impacted by the pandemic. The first donations came from individual members of the Foundation's Board of Directors and from members of its Community Leadership and Engagement Committee. Those folks quickly raised more money from area businesses such as Atlantic City Electric and from Holman Enterprises a family business headquartered in South Jersey. They then sought and received grants, including \$475,000 from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. To date, the South Jersey COVID-19 Response Fund has raised and distributed over \$663,000!

To be absolutely clear: Not a penny of our AAUW-AC Fund's assets went into the South Jersey COVIT-19 Response Fund for two reasons: First, we had not yet transferred our money from the Bank to the CFSJ, and Secondly, even if our Fund we had been in the CFSJ, our Board had not voted to donate to the Covid-19 Fund. That does not mean that we should not consider doing so in the future.

As the pandemic continued the South Jersey COVID-19 Response Fund [CRF] continued to raise and distribute grants. Most recently, Andy Fraizer, Executive Director of the CFSJ announced results of the fourth round of grants awarded from the COVID-19 Response Fund. Twenty-one grants totaling \$180,000 were awarded to South Jersey nonprofits on the front lines supporting residents impacted by the Coronavirus pandemic. Some recent recipients which you may know and personally support are:


Arc of Cape May County – South Dennis, NJ With a grant of \$10,000, the Arc will purchase equipment and train staff to continue delivering social outreach support, remote enrichment activities, and enhance residents' access to healthcare through new telemedicine technology across 17 group homes and assisted-living apartments in Cape May County.

CASA of Atlantic and Cape May Counties – Somers Point, NJ With a grant of \$5,000, CASA will purchase equipment and train volunteers to continue advocating for foster youth in Atlantic and Cape May counties remotely through technology. The grant funds an online case management system.

Jewish Family Service of Atlantic and Cape May Counties – Margate, NJ With a grant of \$10,000, Jewish Family Service of Atlantic and Cape May will continue operating their food pantry, provide transportation to seniors in order to access medical services, provide homeless services in partnership with AtlantiCare, and provide telehealth services.

Faith Baptist Church – Pleasantville, NJ With a grant of \$3,000 (and in partnership with the Community Food Bank of NJ), the Church will purchase equipment to continue distributing food to the Pleasantville community.

MudGirls Studios – Linwood is providing food assistance and emergency basic needs assistance.

Eastern Service Workers Association – Pleasantville is providing food assistance and emergency basic needs assistance.

Salvation Army Atlantic City – Union is supplying personal protective equipment and food assistance.
