There will be an open public meeting of the Board, in person and by ZOOM, on Tuesday, December 14th at 5:30 p.m. to report those municipalities which will have Ward modifications.

Election 2021 is mostly complete, perhaps leaving some AAUW members hopeful, surprised or confused with the results. Our democracy works when everyone can fully participate. Elected officials routinely make decisions about issues that directly impact all of us. Participating in elections is a way for all to contribute to policies and legislation that may affect our future. Our organization's policy states "AAUW is committed to open and fair elections, nonpartisan voter education efforts that will promote

equitable political participation...". Our community will change as needed if members (1) become familiar with trending issues, (2) give extra thought to matters which affect our families, then (3) learn about candidates who will put the best course of action to work. Engaging in this way is an ongoing thing, the next election will be taking place shortly.

Tallies show AAUW 2021 election has resulted in Julia Brown's re-election as AAUW board chair for three more years. Also, the ballot initiative to eliminate the membership requirement got 63% of the vote, which was just below the two-thirds majority needed to enact a bylaw change.



We have started reading and discussing "Robert E Lee and Me" by Ty Seidule. He is a professor emeritus of West Point and a retired brigadier general when he retired from the US Army after 36 years of service. The book discusses "the Myth of the Lost Cause" which he, as a Virginian and graduate of Washington and Lee University, was steeped in. Recently we have been talking about the Rosenwald schools which were established throughout the South from 1912 to 1932 for African American children by a partnership

between Julius Rosenwald (CEO of Sears) and Booker T Washington.

Nearly 5,000 schools served Black students across the South until Brown vs. the Board of Education ended the "separate but equal" doctrine. We were impressed to learn about the extent of these schools whose graduates include Maya Angelou, John Lewis, and Medgar Evers.
