Anne formatted the dialogue into the beautiful invitation with Carol's artwork. Carol and I got them printed, Jill and Linda continued to look for sketches and get gift cards, and we presented, "A Night of Humor" on Thursday, November 17. We had 21 attendees and I think everyone enjoyed the humor of Carol Burnett, Erma Bombeck, Betty White, The Golden Girls, and Lucille Ball. But, more importantly, we have had close to 40 members and friends making very generous contributions to our fundraiser. In collaboration with the Richard Stockton University's Dean of Education, Claudine Keenan, three STEM Camps are held during the year.

The first STEM Camp called Tween Trek will be held on March 17th at Stockton University. This program is for middle school girls from school districts throughout Southern New Jersey for a day of hands-on Science, Technology, Engineering and Math workshops. Each girl chooses workshops of interest to them about the many opportunities available in the STEM fields. Funding for this program is provided by

the local school districts.

Please consider volunteering for the day to help by escorting girls to presentations, classrooms, and rest areas as needed. The girls must be chaperoned at all times. This will be for an entire "school day." Because Stockton University will be on Spring Break at this time, parking will be easy!

This Fall found us ramping up with our tutoring program. In the past few months, we have supported clients in passing 3 Praxis tests (so we're up to 19 tests passed in just over 2 years, if you're counting!). We are also now working with AVANZAR in tutoring for high-school equivalency for students who have had very difficult lives. Most haven't been in school for 6 or more years, but we are building relationships and now have 3 clients participating in that program. This fall, due to teacher shortages, the State of New Jersey allowed some school districts to accept teachers with Limited CEs (certificates of eligibility) to teach. It was very confusing for nearly everyone and we were able to work with teachers to help them navigate the new requirements. Essentially, a bachelor's degree is still required to get the Limited CE, but teachers can waive one of the 4 other requirements needed to teach. Those are:

- Minimum number of subject-matter course content credits;
- Minimum required grade point average (3.0);
- Minimum score on a Commissioner-approved assessment of basic skills or core competencies; or
- Passing score on New Jersey state-approved Praxis subject-matter assessments.



So, while this was a help to many, if a teacher did not achieve all other requirements, the Praxis was still required. AND, they still need to take it, but they have 5 years to do so. Many of the teachers we talked to got jobs in Atlantic County and know we are here to support them when they need to get that Praxis passed.

And in new news.....the Burlington County Branch of AAUW is very interested in starting their own TEE program and have been talking with us about how to do that. More to come on this exciting development! If you are interested in tutoring, please contact Virginia Rettig!

IMPORTANT CHANGE IN DATE


We usually meet on the 4th Friday of the month but due to the holidays we'll meet on:
