My thanks to Tula Christopoulos, Jenine Brown and Janet Yunghans for all their work and support! We've accomplished so much together during this past year.

- Created new Interest Groups The Salon, Explorer's Group & Movie Documentaries
- Held seven programs this year ranging from a visit to the Alice Paul Institute to learning about the NJ Economic Development Authority for offshore wind energy projects. Our highest attendance was 44 at our Woman of Distinction & Women's History Month luncheon.
- ♣ Partnered with other Atlantic County Organizations —Children's Theater Partnership with Stockton University, AVANZAR (Atlantic County Women's Center) & the Atlantic County Collaborative for Educational Equity.
- Tutors for Educational Equity (TEE) helped teachers pass 25 tests and 12 people were hired as full-time teachers. This would not have been possible without the support of two grants totaling \$1,750 from the AAUW-NJ Charitable Trust. And your contributions of over \$600 that launched this important initiative.
- Members volunteered to staff both the July STEM Camp for high school teenagers and the March workshop for middle school girls both held at Stockton University.
- Raised over \$9,400 to fund college scholarships for students in Southern New Jersey and for New Jersey teenage girls attending STEM summer camp at Stockton University.
- **♣** Ten new members joined us from last July through this April. At 122 members, we are the largest Branch in the State of NJ.
- Created a Membership Brochure to advertise all that an AAUW Atlantic County Branch membership offers.

I'm sincerely grateful to all the Board Officers and our Interest Group leaders for their diligent work on behalf of our Branch. With their leadership efforts and the efforts of all of our members, our Branch is a vibrant community of lifelong learners who believe promoting equity in education for girls and women is an important mission.

Current Balance of our checking account is: \$7,482.30.

Renewal reminders began a week ago for members whose membership expires through July.

Fundraiser for a Salem Community College scholarship in Scientific Glassblowing

Last year AAUW allocated some of the funds raised for scholarships to Salem County Community College to allow a young woman to acquire skills as a scientific glassblower, a vital requirement for medical research and a career that's both stable and well-paying (and with few qualified women).

This year the scholarship committee voted that scholarship recipients should come from Atlantic or Cape May County. Since no female applicant for this program hails from either county, the scholarship money raised to date cannot help fund the education of a woman in the glassblowing program.



However, some of our members want AAUW's support to continue and have pledged the seed money for a scholarship for the next school year. We will have a one-hour docent tour to learn how the ACUA makes use of renewable energy to clean dirty water (wastewater) from homes and businesses in Atlantic County. There are 5 wind turbines and 2700 solar panels that generate electricity. You will learn about today's wastewater treatment process, how wind turbines and solar panels work and we will have the chance to throw on a hardhat to take an up close look at a wind turbine.

June 9 at 1 PM Atlantic County Historical Society, 907 Shore Road Somers Point Thanks to Mary Rydzewski we will have a private tour of the museum and we will see the Notable Women of Atlantic County display. We will also be able to see early Atlantic City ships, tools and clothing.


Book Group
