Students struggle financially, and this is of greater impact on women, as females make up 60% of the student body.

AAUW program featuring Virginia Rettig, our Community Partnerships Officer and Christine Ruth, founder of the Atlantic City Educational Equity program. The panel included a former client who passed the State Praxis test and is now employed as a high school teacher.



She is currently tutoring other minority clients who need to pass the test. Christine expounded further on the need for textbooks and other materials. The committee decided to donate \$100 to the ACEE program.

Our October luncheon program was held on October 18th in Careme's Restaurant, Atlantic Cape Community College. The topic was How Secondary Education Has Changed Post COVID. Presenters were Dr. Josette Katz, VP of Academic Affairs ACCC and Dr. Claudine Keenan, Dean of Education, Stockton University. The annual Holiday Luncheon will take place Saturday, 12/16/23 from noon to 3pm at Linwood Public Library. Mary Lou Breidenstine will coordinate the potluck luncheon. For 2024, the committee decided not to hold a program in January. Both February and March meetings will be held via Zoom. We will have a one hour presentation in the conference room by Howard Kyle, President/CEO of NARTP. He will explain projects with the Air Force and FAA.
