Greetings to all! It is my honor to be elected Co-President of our AAUW Branch. And I am delighted to be partnering with Jeanmarie Mason. I joined AAUW in 1968 – yes, 57 years ago and so I know longtime members and I hope to get to know all the new members very soon.

Lenni Lenape, Unami, and Unalachtigo.
3. High Tea Fundraiser, November 15th, 12 Noon to 3 p.m. at Flanders in Ocean City. Please plan to come and bring friends. Registration information is below. The net proceeds support AAUW Scholarships and STEM Camp. Also please consider making a special donation to these causes.

AAUW focuses on education, economic security for women, social justice, civil rights, and federal priorities.

AAUW's 2025–2027 Federal Action Priorities:

- To support equitable access to higher education—and to reduce the barriers that hinder women's advancement, especially women of color—AAUW advocates for:
- Reinstating Title IX rules that strengthen and clarify protections for student survivors of sexual harassment and assault, ensure accommodations for pregnant and parenting students, and affirm protections based on sexual orientation and gender identity.
- Defending inclusive education from attacks on diversity, equity, and inclusion. • Reducing barriers to postsecondary success, including increased financial support and manageable student debt.
- Addressing non-tuition barriers such as paid leave, childcare, and access to contraception and abortion care.

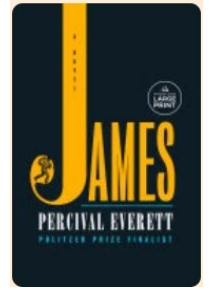
